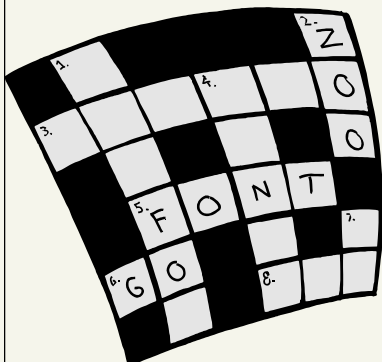

DID YOU KNOW?

May 5 is the anniversary of the first American to be launched into space. Alan Shepard, aboard the Freedom 7, was launched from Cape Canaveral in 1961. This was 23 days after the Russians succeeded with the flight of astronaut, Yuri Gagarin.

The 131st Kentucky Derby will be run on May 7 at Churchill Downs in Lexington, Kentucky. The Kentucky Derby is the first leg of the Triple Crown, which comprises two other races, the Preakness and the Belmont Stakes.

On May 18, 1994, the Flavr Savr tomato was approved for sale by the FDA. This was the start of commercially produced genetically modified foods.
