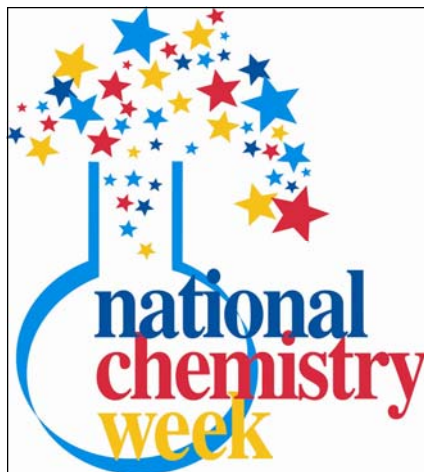

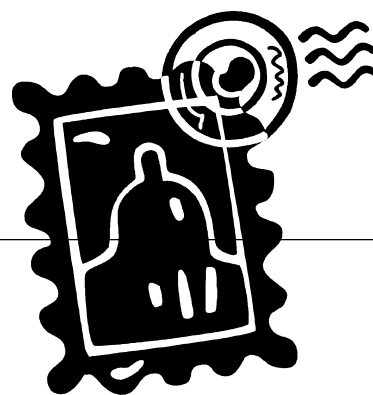


National Chemistry Week, Oct. 16-22, 2005
