Historian to address Nazi-era 'Reshuffling'

Rutherford presents "'Racial Reshuffling' and the Nazi War

Economy: An Ordering of Priorities" at 4:30 p.m. Monday in Main Hall 201.

A specialist on the Nazi era, Rutherford will examine the implementation of Nazi resettlement schemes at the start of World War II in German-occupied western Poland that involved the deportation of what they considered "ethnically inferior" Poles.

The presentation is based on Rutherford's 2007 book "Prelude to the Final Solution: The Nazi Program for Deporting Ethnic Poles, 1939-41."

Dean to discuss liberal arts, entrepreneurship
