

UWFV professors, musicians collaborate on multimedia show

MENASHA — Two professors at the University of Wisconsin-Fox Valley have collaborated on an art exhibit and multimedia show.

Titled "Emergence," Judith Baker Waller, professor of art, and John Beaver, associate professor of physics and astronomy, integrated art and science. They have titled their art exhibit "Out of the Blue" and their multimedia show "Into the Black."

Matt Turner, an avant-garde

musician, plays a major role in the production and performances of "Into the Black."

"Out of the Blue" is on exhibit in the campus' Bohrod Art Gallery until March 21. The exhibit features Beaver's photography and Waller's paintings and drawings. The Gallery is open Monday through Friday from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m., and on Saturday from noon to 8 p.m.

"Into the Black" is being shown in the UWFV Curler Gallery and in the Barlow Planetarium from Feb. 27 to March 21. Turner has written

and produced a new score that's based on numerous conversations with the artists about their images and themes. His musical work provides the soundtrack for "Into the Black," and it includes images and themes that anchor the composition and give it a sense of structure.

While admission to the Curler Gallery is free, there is a fee for the multimedia presentation in the planetarium. The premier performance for "Into the Black" is scheduled for 6 p.m. on Feb. 27, with

other performances scheduled for 6 p.m. on March 6, 8, 13, and 21. The charge for adults is \$7 and \$5 for students.

A reception, free and open to the public, is scheduled from 6 to 8 p.m. Feb. 27 in the Bohrod Gallery.

"Emergence" was produced by Beaver, Waller and Turner
